HEALTH CARE ACCESS - What we do....

Our agency connects the residents of the greater Phoenixville area with health care services. We do this by providing the funding to pay local providers who provide the care.

The care we fund is **dental, vision, emergency orthopedic, prescription medications, and mammograms.**

In order to qualify, you must live in our service area, 19 townships and boroughs surrounding Phoenixville. You must not have insurance coverage for the care we offer and meet our financial guidelines for assistance. All you need to do is give us a call and we can screen you for eligibility over the phone. Then we'll have you complete an application. Once

qualified, we'll refer you to a local provider most convenient for you. We do ask those that can afford to, contribute towards the cost of their care so that we can help as many people as possible.

All of our eye doctors and dentists (and our one orthopedic specialist) have agreed to accept discounted fees for the care they provide. They are committed to partnering with us to improve the health of the community.

We help people who need medications on a long term basis obtain them through the drug manufactures' PAP-Patient Assistance Programs. We also help with emergency supplies of medications.

Women (and men) who are in need of a mammogram screening can obtain one for free through our mammogram program. We fund routine and diagnostic screenings via a partnership with the Phoenixville Hospital, U of P Community Radiology and the Breast Cancer Awareness Coalition.

We do all this to fulfill our MISSION to improve the quality of life in the greater Phoenixville area by helping residents obtain the health care they need.

Highlight on “Dressing on a Dime” Annual Fundraiser

The Breast Cancer Awareness Coalition was formed in 1999 by the Phoenixville Hospital and the Phoenixville Community Health Foundation (PCHF). Then, the hospital under U of P, the PCHF provided the funding for the Coalition and the hospital provided discounted mammograms. The Program was administered by the Phoenixville Hospital’s Community Health Education and Outreach Department. When Community Health Systems acquired the hospital, PCHF could no longer fund the program. It continued in diminished capacity until Phoenixville Healthcare Access Foundation (PHCAF) began to partner with the hospital for routine mammograms. The Coalition, now a part of PHCAF, is a group of dedicated women who strongly believe in their mission to *ensure that all women within the greater Phoenixville area have access to information, screenings, and diagnostics regardless of economic circumstance or insurance coverage*. They continued to meet monthly to plan for education and assessment of need. About 5 years ago, they decided to commit to funding the gap between routine mammograms and diagnostic mammograms, thus “Dressing on a Dime” to raise funds.

The Community Free Mammogram Program, as it was known then, became part of PHCAF’s Mammogram Program last year. It is a partnership between the Phoenixville Hospital, U of P Community Radiology, PHCAF, and the Breast Cancer Awareness Coalition. It provides free routine screening mammograms to women of the greater Phoenixville area without insurance as well as further diagnostic tests to those that need them.

The third annual “**Dressing on a Dime**” event was held on October 16, 2011. It included a lovely brunch, basket raffles, and a fashion show featuring fashions from the Phoenixville Hospital Thrift Shop, with cancer survivors as models. This event continues to be a true celebration of men and women living with cancer, while raising much needed funds for diagnostic screenings. Our hats go off to all the past and present members of the Breast Cancer Awareness Coalition!!!
